<u>REPORT FROM THE FIRE CHIEF</u> There was no report at this time.

REPORT FROM THE RESCUE SQUAD CHIEF There was no report at this time.

REPORT FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE Chief Taglialatela reported for the month of October there were 648 calls for Andover Township, there were 10 for Andover Borough, Hamburg Borough had 375 and Green Township, 37 calls. Year to date as of November 7 there were 13,306 calls for service.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC Seeing no hands, Deputy Mayor Phoebus closed the public portion of this meeting.

NO. 2010-12 ISSUANCE OF FRANCHISE TO SERVICE ELECTRIC CABLE TV OF NEW JERSEY, INC.

"AN ORDINANCE GRANTING MUNICIPAL CONSENT TO THE ISSUANCE OF A FRANCHISE TO SERVICE ELECTRIC CABLE TV OF NEW JERSEY, INC. TO CONSTRUCT, OWN, OPERATE, EXTEND AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEM IN THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, SETTING FORTH CONDITIONS ACCOMPANYING THE GRANT OF SAID MUNICIPAL CONSENT AND PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION AND USE OF SAID SYSTEM"

Deputy Mayor Phoebus opened the public hearing for this ordinance. Seeing no hands, she closed the public hearing.

An ordinance of which the foregoing is the title was introduced and passed on first reading at the regular meeting of the Andover Township Committee, on October 25, 2010, was advertised according to the law and was brought before the public for final consideration. There being no objections, Mr. Smith moved the adoption of the above entitled ordinance, seconded by Mr. Boyce. Roll call vote:

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>MR. SMITH.</u> He reported the Senior Citizens Club will celebrate Thanksgiving at Farmstead on Monday, November 15. The next regular meeting is scheduled for December 6 at the Senior Center in Andover Borough.

Reporting on the Board of Health the New Jersey Department of Agriculture they reported there was no major infestation detected in Andover Township from the fall gypsy moth egg mass survey. He added that the free rabies clinic is scheduled for January 7 for all cats and dogs.

Mr. Smith spoke about the SWAC meeting for tomorrow night and the major issue is the closing of the local landfill in 2017.

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COMMITTEE REPORTS (CONTINUED)

<u>MR. BOYCE</u>. He reported that the Action Alliance Anti-Drug meeting was held on October 26 at the Long Pond School. He thanked Sergeant Danielson and Officer Mosner for presenting an excellent discussion of the growing drug problem in Sussex County. They expressed a real concern for marijuana possession that has skyrocketed in the past year. Several days following that meeting there were 3 or 4 busts on Stickles Pond Road and three of our young people were arrested for illegal marijuana possession. There was also an underage drinking party. The officers had explained that underage drinking is becoming a huge problem. He stated that are continuing our efforts and there is another meeting on November 30 at the school. They will invite all the parents to attend and bring their children.

Mr. Boyce added that Judge Mulhern gave notice that he decided not to continue beyond his current term, which expires December 31st. He thanked the Judge for many years of service to the township. A subcommittee has been selected to interview candidates.

MS. PHOEBUS. She congratulated the fire department and the current president Rick Melfi, their current chief Dan Crater and past chief Gil Taglialatela were in the audience for returning \$5,000 offered to them in their budget for their use this year. The department notified the Township that they would like to return the funds in order to offset any shortfalls in the budget. She said the department does fundraisers all year long to raise money so for them to return these funds is truly remarkable. Our volunteers and residents work very hard together to help the taxpayers and the governing body.

She then congratulated Rick Melfi and the Economic Development Advisory Committee in receiving a nomination from the Economic Development Partnership. She read the letter announcing the nomination for the Municipal Award. Deputy Mayor Phoebus stated it is through the hard work of the EDAC of the Township that this nomination was made possible. There is a Land Use Board meeting tomorrow night.

REPORT FROM THE CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR She reported the Cub Scouts from Troop 81, Den #2 visited the municipal building, the DPW garage, and the police headquarters last Thursday in an effort to obtain their government badge. Everyone introduced themselves and gave a short report on what they do. The scouts asked great questions.

REPORT FROM THE MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY Because of the recent decision relating to COAH at the next meeting he should have more information from the League of Municipalities relative to the third round rules. He will provide a report at that time. On the Krueger litigation, there is a challenge from a Sparta resident on this matter. With respect to the Ray's Inn liquor license, we did receive a final order from the Office of Administrative Law that the matter has been dismissed.

Mr. Smith moved to change the next meeting from November 22, 2010 to November 29, 2010, seconded by Mr. Boyce and carried unanimously.
