The Committee discussed correspondence from a business owner requesting the Committee to turn Current Drive from a one-way street back into a two way street.

The Mayor asked Police Chief Eric Danielson who was present in the audience to give a brief description, of the history of making Current Drive a one way. .The Committee noted that the requestor did not cite any safety issues to warrant a change.

There was discussion regarding the Sussex County 911 Dispatch System. The discussion included comments made by committee members such as, Andover residents are paying for two psaps, and payments are not covering the costs to run the service.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Dog Park; A brief discussion continued regarding a possible dog park at the Lake Iliff Access Area. Residents will still have access to boating even if there is a Dog Park. The Open Space Committee and volunteers continue to clear the area of invasive species.

Police Chief Eric Danielson informed the committee and the audience that anyone using the 911 reverse service needs to re-register with his or her home phones and/or cell phones due to a new vendor service. D. Blackburn reported that three of the committees she is a member of, Land Use Board, Sustainable Andover and the Environmental Commission have not met since the last township committee meeting and therefore nothing new to report.

T. Walsh reported that October is brush pickup month by our DPW and leaf pickup during the month of November. Recreation information may be viewed on the township's website and on Facebook. The tennis courts are closed for two weeks. He also reported that the Economic Development Committee has had some activity.

J. McGovern announced that she would like to have another volunteer day to clean up the access area and have the DPW chip the brush.

She also reported that the Andover Township Tax Collector met with the seniors and they had a very informative session. The Tax Collector had also supplied them with forms and was very well received. She thanked Daryn for coming to the meeting.

Board of Education has a new Business Administrator, Donna Mosner. The School Board is looking for a new principle. The Open Space Committee is meeting on the 2nd Wed. of the month at 2pm at the Hillside House.

M. Lensak reported that we are still taking applications for the fundraiser, Horse Shoe Tournament set for October 13 at the municipal building. The deadline for registration is October 1, 2015. He also reported the Police Department is still having issues with Willow Glen residents.

REPORT FROM THE MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY


The Township Attorney reported that the lawsuit filed by Leesnra against the town has been dismissed by a Superior Court Judge. There is no other pending litigation at this time.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE AMENDMENT TO THE MUNICIPAL SHARED SERVICES DEFENSE AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Andover entered into the Municipal Shared Services Defense Agreement (“MSSDA”) for the purpose as set forth therein, which included retaining a common expert in the Declaratory Judgment action (“Litigation”) that was filed in accordance with In the Matter of the Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 and 5:97 by the New Jersey Council on Affordable Housing, 221 N.J. 1 (2015) (“Decision”); and

WHEREAS, the MSSDA identified Dr. Robert Burchell, a distinguished professor at Rutgers University, as the expert to be retained; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Burchell became ill and has been unable to complete the obligations under the Research Agreement as set forth in the MSSDA; and

WHEREAS, as a result, Rutgers University has exercised its right to terminate the Research Agreement as permitted under its terms; and

WHEREAS, the MSSDA requires modification to allow the members to retain one or more alternative experts, consultants and/or other professionals for the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, an Amendment to the MSSDA (“Amendment”) has been prepared to effectuate the modification; an

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Andover recognizes that the Litigation requires immediate action and may require further expedited actions by its counsel determined to be necessary and appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Andover has determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Township to approve the Amendment, and/or to affirm and ratify the Amendment, and to authorize their designated counsel to take actions on behalf of the municipality with regard to the multiplicity of issues raised and associated with the continued implementation of the MSSDA;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Andover, as follows:

1. The terms and conditions of the Amendment to MSSDA attached hereto are hereby approved, and/or ratified and confirmed.

2. The Mayor and Township Clerk, be and are hereby authorized to execute the aforesaid Amendment.
3. The Township Committee of the Township of Andover hereby authorizes Jeffrey R. Surenian, Esq., to execute an agreement on behalf of the Andover with Econsult Solutions, Inc.

The Township Committee of the Township of Andover hereby authorizes Jeffrey R. Surenian, Esq., to execute on behalf of the Township with the approval of the Town's designated counsel such other agreement(s) as are advisable to effectuate the purposes of the MSSDA as amended.

4. The Township Committee of the Township of Andover further authorizes its designated counsel to approve such other changes to the MSSDA as may be necessary to effectuate its purposes, and to take action on behalf of the municipality with regard to the multiplicity of issues raised and associated with the implementation of the MSSDA provided that the action will not require the municipality to appropriate and commit any additional funding for the MSSDA.


In the event such changes and actions require the municipality to appropriate and commit any additional funding for the MSSDA, Township of Andover shall only be responsible for such funding if it authorizes same.

5. If additional monies are needed to effectuate the intent and purpose of the MSSDA, no such services shall be authorized by designated counsel without further action from the Town.
6. A copy of the Municipal Shared Services Agreement and Amendment to same shall remain on file in the Township Clerk's office and available for public inspection.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-13

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ANDOVER, COUNTY OF SUSSEX,
STATE OF NEW JERSEY REPEALING SECTION 10-10(B), ENTITLED "NIGHT
PARKING RESTRICTED", OF CHAPTER 10
OF THE ANDOVER TOWNSHIP CODE**

WHEREAS, Chapter 10 of the Township Code, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic," at Section 10-23(A) provides that: "Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the streets or highways, including town-owned and operated parking lots, an emergency shall exist and no vehicle shall be parked on any street or highway or portion thereof. This parking prohibition shall remain in effect for an eight-hour period following the cessation of such snowfall"; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 10 of the Township Code, entitled "Vehicles and Traffic," at Section 10-10(B) provides that: "Night parking restricted. No person shall park a vehicle in the Township of Andover between the hours specified during the period commencing November 15 of each year and continuing through and including April 15 of the following year"; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-10(B) is applicable to both sides of all streets within the Township between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.; and

WHEREAS, the Township Code, at Section 10-23(A), already prohibits parking when the roadways are covered with snow and, therefore, Section 10-10(B), which provides for no parking on the streets of Andover between November 15th and April 15th, the intent of which latter section was to prevent and prohibit parking on streets within the Township at night when there may be snow on the street, is no longer necessary and can be repealed.

WHEREAS, the Township Committee has determined that it wishes to abolish and/or repeal Section 10-10(B) of the Township Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Andover, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 10-10(B) of the Township Code is repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2. All ordinances of the Township of Andover which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.


SECTION 5. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.
